April 13-14, 2009, WFMY2 (NBC), Channel 2, Greensboro, North Carolina, Featured in story titled "Uncle Charlie's War". Top news story on all news broadcasts on April 13, 2009 and the morning and afternoon news on April 14, 2009. Case has been highly publicized in previous broadcasts in March 2009. The issue involves bringing an 89 year old African-American World War II veteran home to the Salisbury, North Carolina VA Medical Center. The veteran is being kept, despite his wishes at a VA Medical Center in Ohio. Professor brought into the case at the request of North Carolina Congressman Howard Coble, 11th Congressional District, as well as his District Representative in Greensboro, North Carolina.
